Next, craft eyes of ender using your gathered resources. Throw one of the eyes by right-clicking, following its path until it falls. Repeat this process until the eye drops where you threw it, indicating that you've found a stronghold directly beneath your feet. To access the End dimension safely, dig down in a spiral or staircase fashion to land near an incomplete end portal. Once you have all required supplies, set up the end portal by placing the eyes of ender into the incomplete spots, and activate the portal immediately.
