


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Oaks classical christian academy

On the other hand, Oaks Classical Christian Academy is planning to build a new school building in Spokane Valley. The project, which was delayed due to the pandemic, will be built on 8.2 acres of land purchased from Valley Fourth Church. The estimated cost of the two-story, 42,500-square-foot building is \$7.6 million. However, plans for the second story have been put on hold until additional financing can be secured. The new building aims to provide more space for the growing student population and expand some programs. The first floor will feature 12 classrooms, offices, and a large open-space area designed for school gatherings. The Oak's Classical School has expanded its curriculum by offering song and dance classes within its conservatory. The institution is also working on developing specialized programs for students with unique needs as well as those participating in sports. The school has launched a fundraising campaign, aiming to collect \$12.5 million in total, with an initial target of securing \$8 million by June. Although they have already reached half of their goal, Dowers mentions that additional funds might still be required. Founded in 1996, Oak's Classical initially focused on providing classical Christian education through its curriculum. The school currently employs 68 staff members, including 27 full-time teachers, and anticipates hiring two to three more employees once the new facility opens. With a student body of 355, students from both Spokane and Kootenai counties are drawn to the institution for its comprehensive education in grades K-12.
