You could learn how to perform phlebotomy on patients and take EKG readings, alongside your existing skills. Medication Aide Certification (MACE) Taking the MACE can train you to give medications to patients - a skill not all CNAs have. This certification will make you much more employed as a CNA. The Most Important Soft Skills for Your CNA Resume Soft skills will help you complete your day-to-day tasks as a CNA. But more importantly, they will show a hiring manager that you can do the work that will be asked of you if you get the job. For applicants without prior work experience, soft skills to include on your CNA resume! Communication Working as a CNA will require you to communicate clearly with your patients about their needs - but also with the other members of their care team. If you're capable of that, you could really thrive as a CNA. Organization Your tasks as a CNA will vary from day to day, according to your patient's needs. If you can keep on top of changing circumstances without compromising the quality of your work, hiring managers will be much more likely to take your application seriously.
