The test consists of 25 multiple-choice questions covering traffic laws, safe driving practices, road signs and signals, vehicle maintenance, driving under the influence (including fatigue), and sharing the road as outlined in the state's Iowa DOT 2025 Driver's Manual. To pass, you must score at least 80% (28 out of 25 questions). Iowa offers an online option for taking the knowledge test called "Skip the Trip." You will still need to visit the DOT to submit your documents and undergo the vision screening.If you fail the knowledge test, you must wait until the next business day to retake it and pay a retest fee. The Iowa DOT permit practice tests mimic the actual exam, are updated for June 2025, and provide instant feedback for incorrect responses to help speed the learning process.If under 18, Iowa's Graduated Driver's License (GDL) program introduces driving privileges in phases. At 14 years old, you can apply for an instruction permit, which will allow you to drive with a parent, guardian, or licensed driver who's at least 21. After holding your instruction permit for at least 12 months, completing an approved driver's education course, logging 20 supervised driving hours (including 2 hours at night), and passing a road skills test, you can get an intermediate license at 16. (You can skip the road test if your driver's education course instructor decides you passed the course.) This license allows unsupervised driving but limits passengers and driving times. At 17, you may apply for the unrestricted license if you've held your intermediate license for at least 12 months with no traffic violations in the last six months.If you're at least 18 years old, most of these GDL requirements don't apply to you. However, you must still pass the vision, knowledge, and road skills tests. To apply for your permit, go to the DOT with proof of identity (birth certificate, passport), proof of Social Security number (social security card, W2), two proofs of Iowa residency (utility bill, rental agreement), and a parental consent form if you're under 18. At the local Iowa Department of Transportation office. Yes, Iowa requires completion of driver's education as part of its Graduated Driver's License Program. To transfer your out-of-state Learner's Permit, Intermediate Driver's License or Full Driver's License to an Iowa Learner's Permit or Driver's License, you need to be at least 16 years old, have held your out-of-state permit or license for 12 months, have completed driver's ed, have at least 20 hours of driving practice and not have had any accidents or moving violations in the last six months. The Iowa permit test covers road signs, traffic laws and other rules of the road covered in the Iowa Driver's Handbook. Here are two examples of content from the driver's manual that could be covered on the test: When starting to parallel park, you should signal and stop with the rear bumper of your vehicle even with the rear bumper of the vehicle in front of the place you want to park. Accelerate gradually and smoothly. Trying to start too fast can cause the drive wheels to spin, particularly on slippery surfaces, and cause the vehicle to slide. You will need to answer at least 28 of the questions correctly to pass. You cannot refer to the driver's manual or any notes while taking the test. You can complete the test on your schedule - there is no time limit. Take a practice test formatted like the real thing. You will receive your Learner's Permit and can begin your behind-the-wheel driving practice. You need to log 50 total hours of practice driving, with 10 of those hours coming at night. You can retake it as soon as the next business day. Now you can begin your driving practice with a licensed driver who is a parent or legal guardian, an immediate family member age 21 or older, a driver's ed teacher or a licensed adult age 25 or older. You need to log 20 hours of driving practice, with two of those hours at night. You will also need to complete driver's education. This course will include 30 hours of classroom instruction, 20 minutes on railroad crossing safety and organ donation and six hours of laboratory instruction. To apply for a provisional license you: Need to be at least 16 years old Must have held your Learner's Permit for at least 1 year and have no traffic violations Need to have completed 20 hours of driving practice, with two hours at night Yes, as long as you are accompanied by a qualified driving supervisor. No, you must also complete at least 2 hours of driving at night. Yes, you must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian, an immediate family member age 21 or older, a driver's ed teacher or a licensed adult age 25 or older. You can replace a lost Learner's Permit by visiting a local Iowa driver license office. You will need to present identification like when you applied for your permit. Be sure to practice driving as much as possible and also be sure to pay attention during your driver's ed course. You should also study your Iowa Driver's Manual and apply the tips and concepts revealed in the book to your driving efforts. Finally, don't forget to listen to your driving supervisors and be sure to implement their tips and critiques. You should practice turns, parking, changing lanes, braking, accelerating, checking your mirrors, following at a safe distance and other common driving maneuvers. Ask people who have taken the test to describe what they had to do and practice those maneuvers, such as parking and turning. Your driver's ed teacher should also have insight into what you will be tested on during the driving test. Finally, if possible drive the roads that are included on the test to better familiarize yourself with them. Contact your local driver's license office. During the driving test you will be asked to display competency at both making common driving maneuvers on a course and driving on the road in actual traffic. Some of the maneuvers you may have to perform include parking, turns, stopping, accelerating and more. When driving in traffic you will need to display a good understanding of defensive driving techniques.. Reasons for failure can range from nerves to failing to signal to not checking mirrors to improper hand position on the wheel, speeding and more. When taking the test remember to stay calm and focused on the task at hand. Not paying attention to speed and going over the limit Failing to come to a complete stop Not checking mirrors when changing lanes Overcorrecting during a turn Not driving according to road conditions You can retake the test as soon as you like. No, there is not fee to take the retest. You will receive your provisional license. Restrictions include: You can drive without supervision from 5 a.m. to 12:30 a.m. You can drive with the supervision of a parent or guardian, immediate family member age 21 or older or designated adult 25 or older during the hours of 12:30 a.m. and 5 a.m. Iowa requires all drivers to carry auto insurance. The state's minimum requirements are: \$20,000 bodily injury per person per accident \$40,000 bodily injury for all persons per accident \$20,000/\$40,000 uninsured/underinsured motorist coverage You can renew your Iowa driver's license up to 30 days before the expiration. The Iowa DOT is currently transitioning from a license validity period of 5 years to 8 years and during that period you will be assigned a random expiration date anywhere between 5 and 8 years. If your license is lost or stolen, you can get a duplicate license for a \$10 fee at your local DOT office. You will need to bring identification documents. You can renew your Iowa license online or in person at the local driver's license office. If required to renew in person, the answer to this question is yes. The state of Iowa considers good vision to be essential for safe driving in the state and requires license holders to have a minimum of 20/40 vision in at least one eye, with or without corrective lenses. Instruction Permit When you are 14 years old, you can apply for your Instruction Permit (or learner's permit) in the state of Iowa. While holding this permit, you can practice your driving skills as long as you have a licensed driver age 21 or above in the passenger seat. Before you can get your permit, you'll need to pass a written knowledge test (also known as the permit test). During this test, you will demonstrate your knowledge of traffic laws, signals and signs. Begin Your Driving Practice Now that you have your permit, you can begin to practice. To move on to the next phase in the GDL process, you must complete 18 hours of supervised daytime practice driving and two hours of night practice. You are also required to sign up for a state-approved driver's education course and complete 30 hours of classroom training and six hours of behind-the-wheel training with your instructor. Note: In the state of Iowa, drivers who carry the Instruction Permit have the option of applying for a Minor School License (MSL) when they are 14 and a half years old. This license will allow you to drive without supervision as long as you are going to or from a school-related activity between the hours of 5 a.m. and 10 p.m. You must live within one mile of your school, have completed driver's education, have held your permit for at least six months without any violations and have permission from your parent or guardian to apply for the MSL. Intermediate License When you are at least 16 years old, you have held your permit for at least one year without any violations and you have completed all your required training, you can apply for your Intermediate License. When you are ready, visit your local MVD facility and bring along: Your Instruction Permit. Your parent or guardian and a signed copy of the Parent's/Guardian's Written Consent Form (Form 430018). A certificate of completion for your driver's education course. Proof of identity. Your Social Security number. Proof of residency. \$6 for testing and license fees. At this point, you will be required to take a behind-the-wheel test to show that you know what you're doing on the road. The Iowa Intermediate License comes with a few rules: You may not drive between the hours of 12:30 a.m. and 5 a.m. unless accompanied by a licensed family member age 21 or older or a designated driver age 25 or older. There is an exception for driving to and from work or school. You must log an additional 10 hours of practice driving, with two of those hours taking place at night. You must be supervised by a parent or guardian age 21 or older while doing this practice. You may not use a cell phone while driving except to dial 911 in an emergency situation. Driver's License When you are 17 years old, you can get your full license as long as you don't have any traffic violations. You first must have completed all your practice driving. When you have, simply visit your local MVD facility with \$4 in license fees, and trade your Intermediate License in for a full license. Congratulations! You are now an unrestricted driver. Additional Information The state of Iowa prohibits all drivers from sending text messages or checking the Internet while driving. First-time drivers in Des Moines, Cedar Rapids, Davenport and every other Iowa city must begin their driver's ed journey by studying for the DOT permit test.
