Get the hands-on type when you pick worksheets. Alphabet tracing worksheets for 3 year olds can be just the same as for other ages, but go the extra mile and keep the hands busy on things other than tracing as well. Your child can cut out pictures that begin with the letter you are working on from a magazine, glue correct letters onto their match, or trace letters with shaving cream or sand. Sure, you can use one of the tracing worksheets above, but it might be more fun to lay in the grass on a spring day and trace imaginary letters with your finger pointing up to the sky with your child. The bonus here is that you are outside and learning, too! (Being outside is GREAT for kids) One incentive to getting your child to complete a weekly worksheet for each letter is to put them all together into a little book to take home and show off, plus continue to read and review. You can do this easily by just stapling all the sheets together once they are complete, or you can even go a little more fancy with binding or just tie it together with some cute ribbon!
