The system has been up for 2 weeks now and all the tests is looking good, nothing out the ordinary, ammonia was 0 gone up to 0,1 mg/l 1 day after i added the live rock but it is stable. All the other tests has been in par and safe. All the other nice to have stuff ill check out first and get some info from you guys before i get it, if it is necessary. Now its wait....... and patience to get the eco system to work properly, and hopefully in a month or two i can start adding the beauties and all. I want to do fish and coral so ill have to get some sound advise what too and what not tooooo. Your sump does seem to be setup "old school", but show us a pic of it and we can help you from there, but for now, your skimmer needs to be in the first compartment where the water enters from your tank, the phosphate reactor should be in the last compartment. What skimmer do you have? What substrate do you have on the bottom of the tank? When you buy your fluorescent lights, make sure you get T5 lights and not T8. Your tank will need to cycle for probably another 4 weeks or so before you can start adding fish and corals. It is algae, and yes i know i did go to fast here, they say to wait for the smut algae to disappear in the principle tank and the green algae should be growing in the DSB. This helps the process enourmously. I could not resist :nono: and would do anything in my power to keep a track of the quality of the water, which i have done since day one and im glad to say i did. He assured me it was from a healthy tank and this would speed up the process for me. 2 Days after that he started adding Organic Aqua marine general treatment and Nutrafin cycle that they use on new and emergency setups. On 26/07/2008 i changed the sump to the suggested drawing that warr posted for me, and believe me this changed the test results for the better and the colours of the algae started to change from brown to green from there. On 27/07/2008 i added some water stabilizer that you use when adding fish or inverts, this helps not to get spikes, which i didnt get. On 28/07/2008 i tested the water and all seemed fine. I added the Fire angel (thats what the LFS called it), one firefish and the two tank bread clown fish. I also did a water change and added the stabilizer. And at 20h00 i checked the salinity to see and it was on 1,025 which was normal. On 30/07/2008 i added an extra firefish, a occllatted prawn goby, and the purple fish and they said it was a wrasse im not sure im checking the books on that, i also got the Copper Band (on loan) from the LFS to sort out the Aiptasia (i can report there is absolutely nothing left of this as joes juice would take me a year on the amount of the buggers, i added a yellow stripe angel, purple tip leather anemone, and a zinnias (i think as im looking up the proper names) brown stem with green tips. With some water stabilizer. Ive been testing and checking the water regularly to see if there is a slight change. On 02/08/2008 at 17h00 i did a water test as you can see from above, and it was perfect. I am glad to report that all the fishes are eating well, none of them is showing any stress at all, they are in between the rocks all day long grazing and swimming. I also fed the leather tonight at about 18h00 and it opened up beautifully for the feeding and closed up nicely afterwards. All the pollups is fully opened, and the zinnias has opened completely. So yes guys i was very fast with this, but i am checking daily and surely hope to make a success of this. It is an absolutely fantastic hobby and i would not like anything to die on me as that is not the point of the excercise. I followed the rules laid down by Baensch - marine atlas and some other books as far as i could understand it and what i read on the forum that made sense to me. My LFS is organizing me a bunch or two caulerpa to add the the sump as well, he is just as worried and said i should wait :nono: and at the end took samples and tested the water himself to make sure im not bluffing to get fish.
