It is especially used when planning/scheduling future events.Example: "The tentative date for the Wedding is September 4" (that is the planned date but it could change at any time sort of like "unconfirmed date")"interim" is used more when there is something established temporarily in the meantime (until something else happens later).Example: if a leader of political leader resigns, then an "interim" leader usually takes over in the meantime and then later there may be a vote/election to determine who the 'real' leader should be.== ORIGINAL POST =="He deployed an interim security measure to deal with the problem.""The interim report should be handed in by tomorrow"Your sentence about the plan is not very natural, so it is difficult to say which one is better.However, if you have plan or schedule which is new and subject to change, then you might say "tentative" (example: "Stop following the tentative schedule; there is a new updated schedule available").
